Welcome to the Michigan Reads! One-State, One-Children's Book program presented by the Library of Michigan. The featured book for 2014 is *Acoustic Rooster and His Barnyard Band*, written by Kwame Alexander and illustrated by Tim Bowers. **We encourage the reading of** *Acoustic Rooster and His Barnyard Band* with children statewide during the months of September and October to encourage early and family literacy in your community.

The Library of Michigan is pleased to provide this kit of 2014 Michigan Reads! materials to enable you to share the book and program activities with infants, toddlers, preschoolers and K-2 school-aged children. **If you are in a school, Head Start program or Great Start Readiness program, please coordinate the sharing of these resources among classrooms and the library.** Use the enclosed materials to promote the enjoyment of reading to children and with children to the families of your students or patrons. In our 2014 book, Acoustic Rooster learns about music, teamwork and sportsmanship. After realizing he can't win the barnyard talent contest as a solo act with such fierce competition, a rooster with a love for jazz looks to help from other animals. A quartet with an unbelievable sound is created, with their ability to work together cleverly captured in this book with rhyming text, references to key American musicians, and vivid illustrations.

The 2014 Michigan Reads! program will be kicked off on Monday, September 8, 2014, in conjunction with International Literacy Day. Local libraries and schools will be reading *Acoustic Rooster and His Barnyard Band* aloud that day to children all over the state. We are promoting Michigan Reads! programming in libraries and classrooms throughout September and October. Author Kwame Alexander and illustrator Tim Bowers will tour the state, presenting special Michigan Reads! programs at selected Michigan libraries and schools. The schedule is at www.michigan.gov/mic

Michigan Reads! is a unique "one book" program in that it seeks to boost early-childhood literacy by featuring a book geared specifically towards young children. The program promotes the value and benefits of reading early and often to children, encourages family bonding through reading, and increases awareness and usage of Michigan's public and school libraries as excellent resources for learning.
