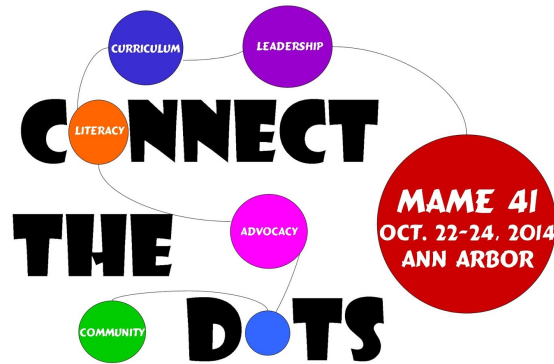


Join Us in Ann Arbor!
