

The Program

In 2010, Neutral Zone and its partners (including the Weikart Center for Program Quality and MSU's Community Evaluation Research Collaborative) began the Youth Driven Spaces (YDS) project. YDS was a 2-year pilot to support programs that serve older youth implement youth voice and decision making structures and strategies that have been developed and tested at the Neutral Zone.

Through YDS, one of the most important strategies disseminated is the teen advisory council (TAC) model. TAC is an effective and meaningful way to provide youth the opportunity and structure to be involved in a range of programmatic and governance projects and decisions. School Advisories is a model derived from this work which has been piloted at several Safe and Supportive Schools (S3) sites in 2012 to present. The Advisories have helped provide students authentic roles and decision making in S3 activities to create a safer and more positive school climate.
