Michigan's POETRY OUT LOUD State Finals

School competitions in 41 locations around Michigan began in fall 2018. Champions from each school will travel to Lansing and recite up to three poems during the State Finals on March I and 2, 2019, at the Crowne Plaza Lansing West (925 S. Creyts Road, Lansing, 48917). Competition rounds are open to the public and begin at the following times:

- Round I: Fri., March I at 3 p.m.
- Rounds 2 & 3: Sat., March 2 at 8:30 a.m.

Prizes and POETRY OUT LOUD National Finals

Each winner at the state level will receive:

- A minimum of a \$200 cash prize and an all-expenses-paid trip to Washington, DC
- A minimum of a \$500 cash stipend for their school to purchase poetry materials
- An opportunity to compete at the 2019 National Finals for the title of National Champion and a \$20,000 prize
