What is TALK?

TALK: Text and Learn for Kindergarten is an early literacy text messaging service developed by 5 libraries in Washtenaw County

Sends developmentally appropriate texts to parents with children 5 and under with activity suggestions and library information they can use to help prepare their little one for school success



Any parent or caregiver in Michigan can sign up to receive messages.


Any public library in Michigan can sign up to offer the service to parents in their community.



Unique features of TALK

- Posters that advertise the service have activity suggestions that can be used in specific sites
- Based on Every Child Ready to Read--a library storytime curriculum
- Allows libraries to send 2 messages/month to let parents know about library programs and services
- Helps libraries partner with all types of community partners--including schools

Promoting TALK to your patrons - QR Codes

- Put them in little free libraries
- Add the code regularly to library newsletters, signage, or monitor displays
