

Seventy-five years ago a 24-year-old, African American secretary Sarah E. Ray was denied a seat on the segregated Boblo boat, *SS Columbia*. Like Rosa Parks, she refused to back down, taking her fight for integration to the US Supreme Court. Ray won her case, which scholars argue paved the way for the 1954 Brown v. Board of Education victory.

Cooper is a former attorney, Pulitzer Prize-nominated journalist, and community activist. Schillinger is a filmmaker whose documentary Boblo Boats: A Detroit Ferry Tale was awarded the 'Hometown Talent' Award at the 2021 Freep Film Festival.
