Circa 50 CE the Romans founded the city of Londinium in the marshy Thames Valley, building the first iteration of what would become London. The city survived fire and rebellion, was home to up to 60,000 people and grew from a small trading port to the provincial capital of Britain. Ellen Green, PhD researcher at the University of Reading in England, explores what day to day life would have been like in the city and how archaeologists are able to reconstruct the urban landscape from what was left behind.
