Meet the Friends of the Cascade Branch of Kent District Library

The Friends of the Cascade Library was founded more than 45 years ago to help fund special programs, new equipment and building improvements for the Cascade branch of the Kent District Library System, which includes 20 branch libraries throughout West Michigan's Kent County.

We have a very dedicated group of about 50 active volunteers and many others on the waiting list. We have 336 dues-paying members of the Friends, but most of our revenues come from the sale of used books in our Chapter Two bookstore, on eBay and at four book sale events throughout the year, with the biggest over the Fourth of July holidays.

We provide financial support for a wide variety of library needs, especially special programs aimed at educating and entertaining children in the community. For example, at Christmas 1,200 people came out for "Reindeer Night" at the library, with wide-eyed kids galore. But, we are particularly excited about a project underway right now that will extend our library outdoors with the development of a picturesque and functional community space for individual relaxation, family gatherings and community events.

The outdoor park will include perennial garden spaces, seating areas, a fountain, benches, a rain garden, enhanced woodland areas, granite stone trails, picnic areas, sidewalks, woodland play areas, a pavilion, nature trails and much more. Development is scheduled to begin this coming fall and be completed by spring of 2024.

Our Friends group is honored to host the Friends of Michigan Libraries' May 19 "Talk About Friends" meeting. Many of FOML's meetings are

concentrated in the eastern half of the state, where their membership is strongest. So, this is a wonderful opportunity for us in "the west" to learn more about the valuable support the group provides to Friends groups. I know FOML has already invited you to attend, but we would also like to extend a personal invitation to join us for the sharing of some great information and relationship building.
